This course picks up from the Web Development course by teaching you the basic design skills needed for web design - including online typography and spacial skills. Then we look at the difference between 'pretty' and 'useful' as we delve into User Interface Design. You'll also learn how you can make a web site 'accessible' to those who have visual challenges (and why you need to know that before you build a web site).

You'll gain experience using one of the most common web design tools. You'll also learn the two key coding means (HTML and CSS) to make all those 'nice looks' become a reality.

When you are done with this course you will be able to create a professional looking web site and/or get your foot in the door as a web developer/designer.
